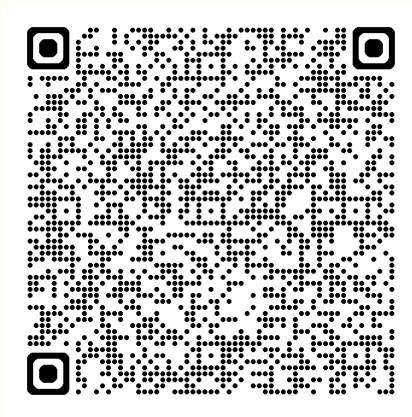


SEICAA Community Services

- We promote citizen participation in community initiatives.

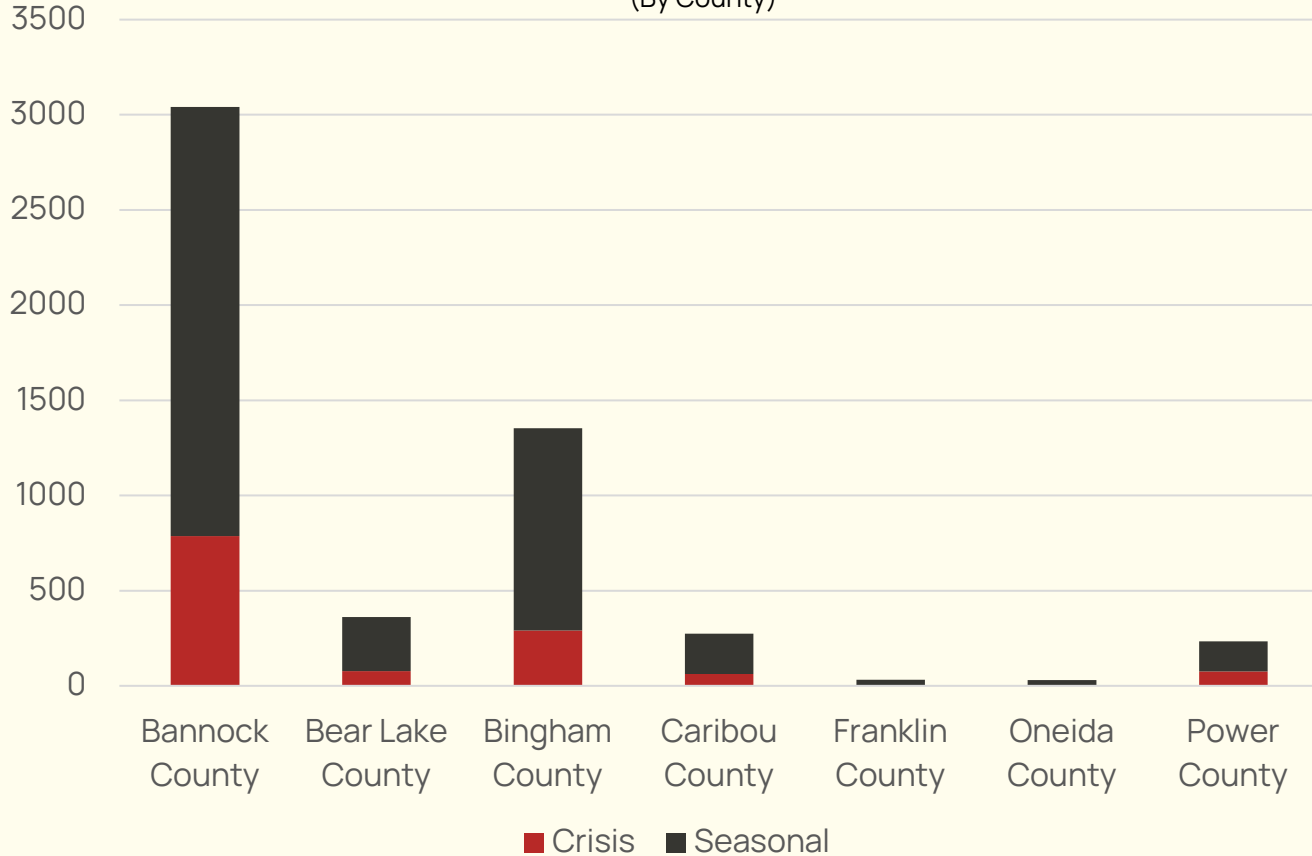

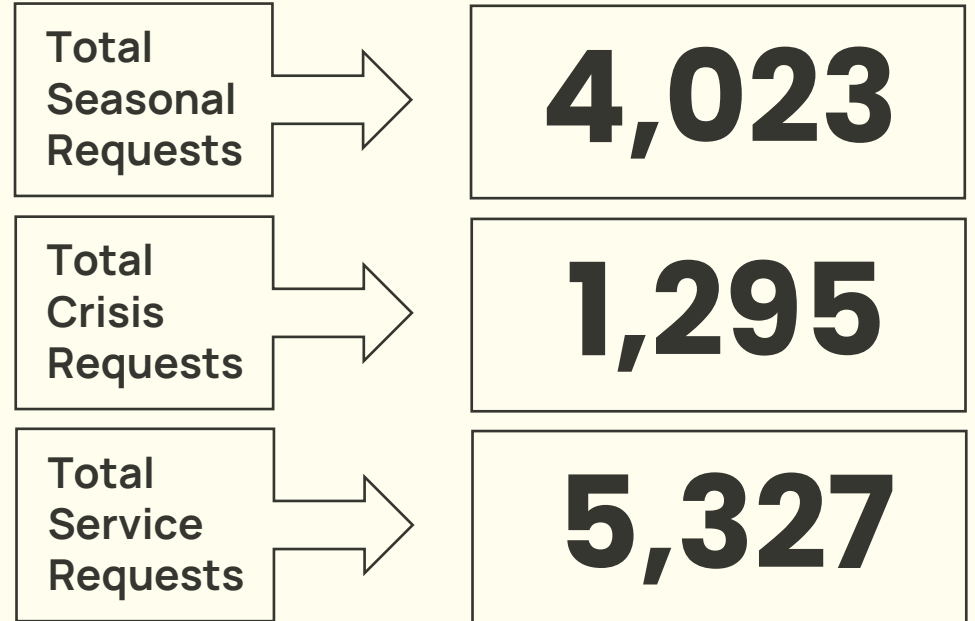

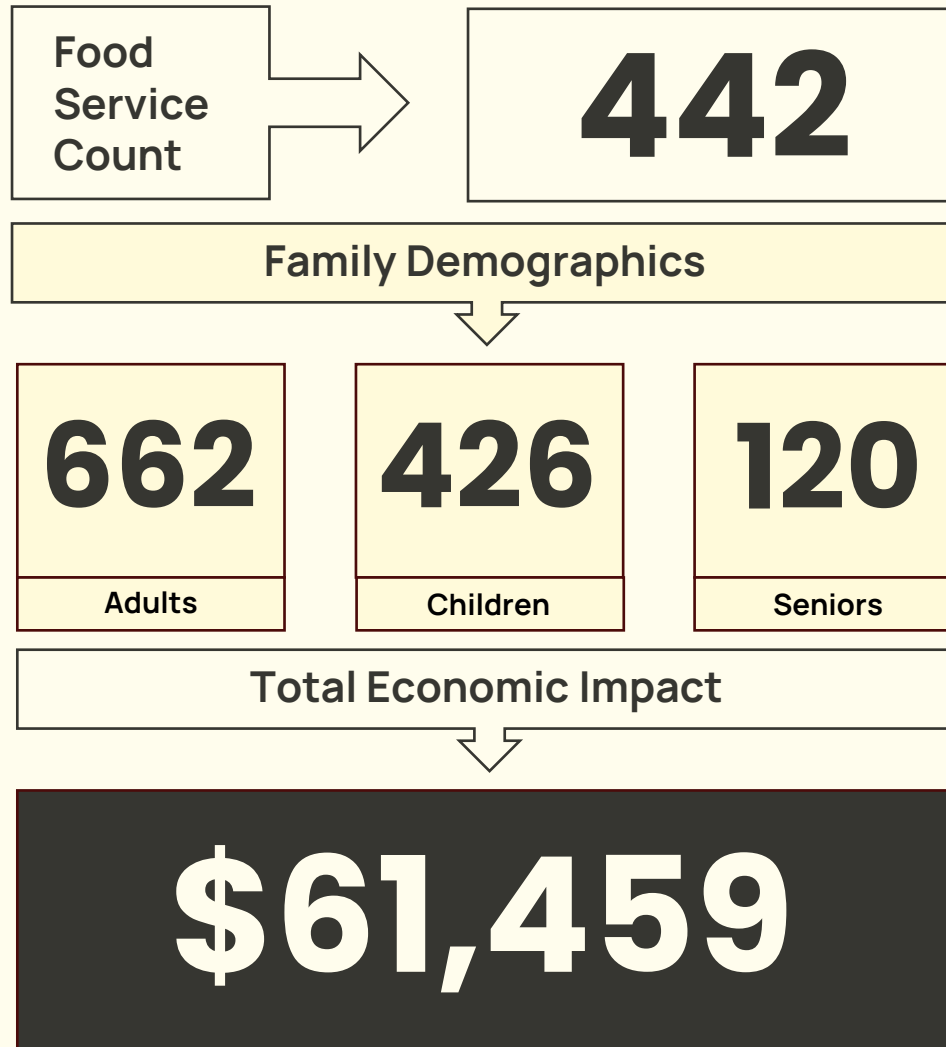

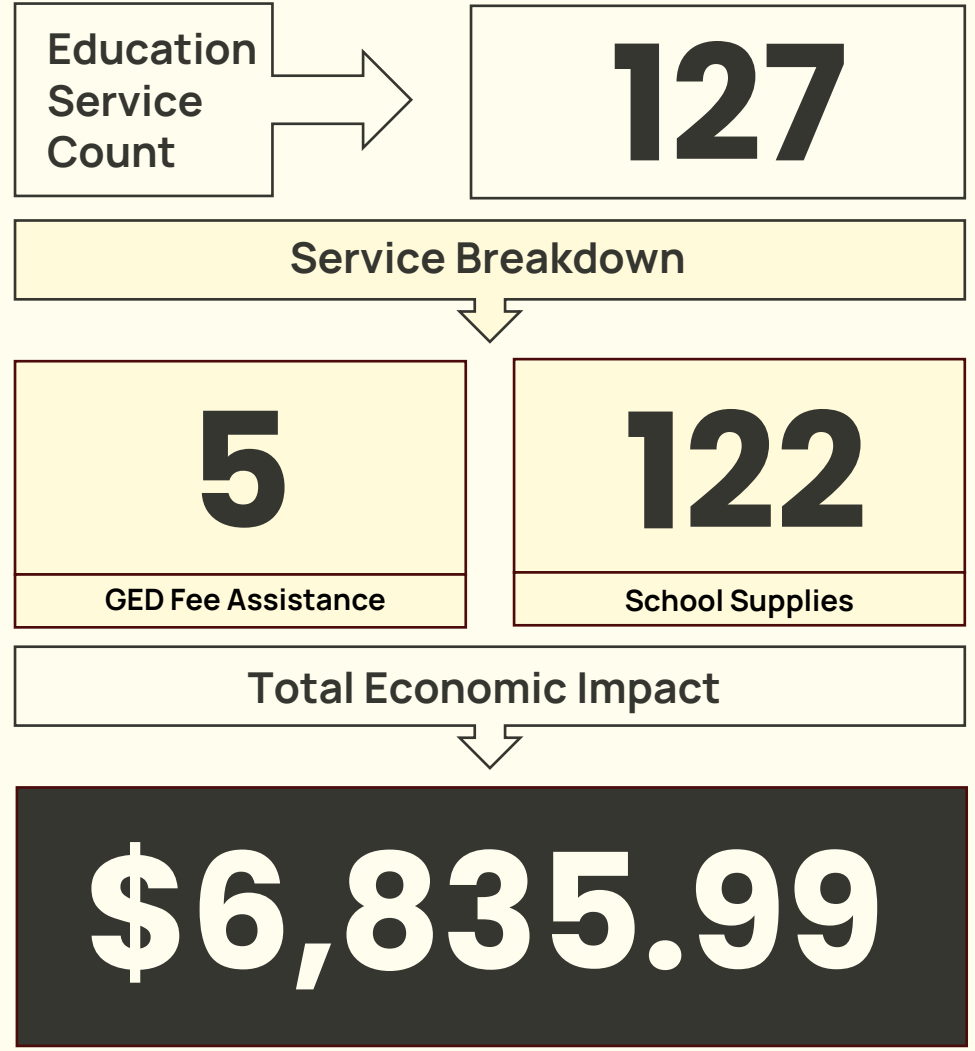

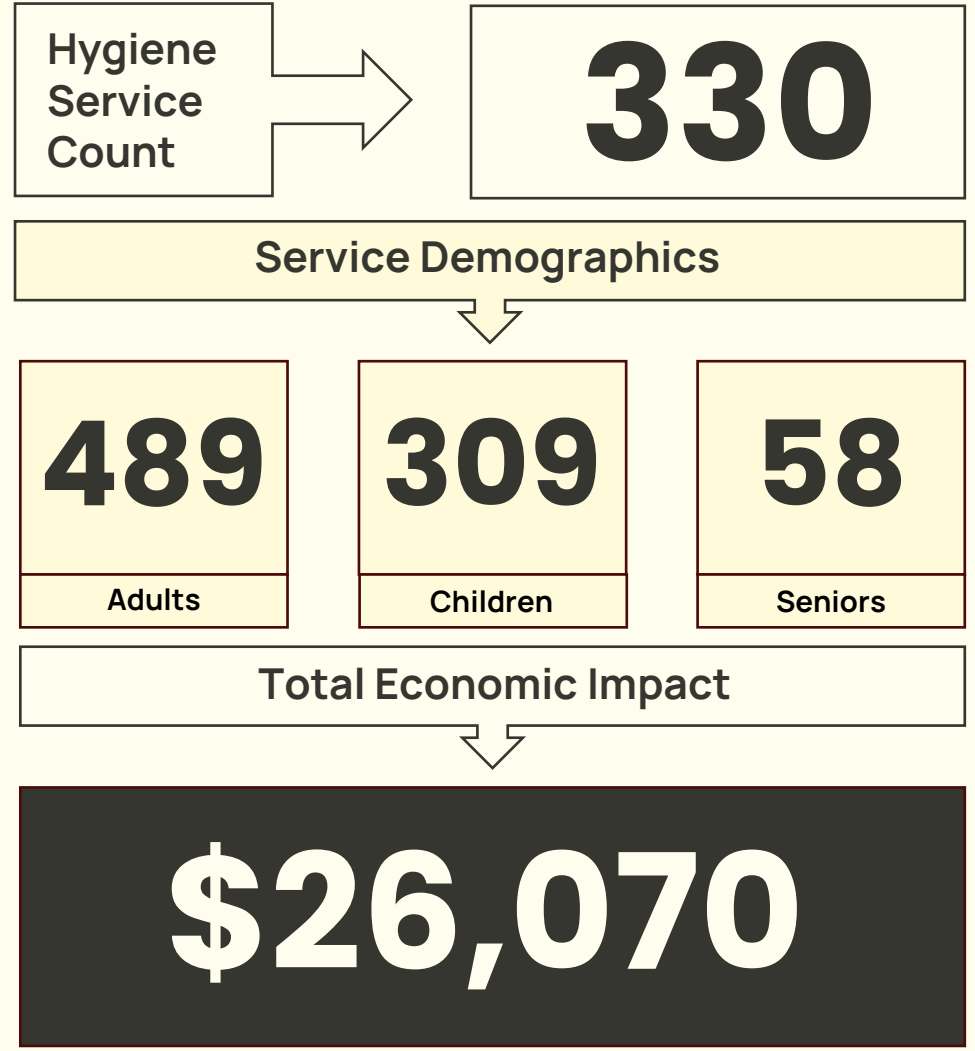

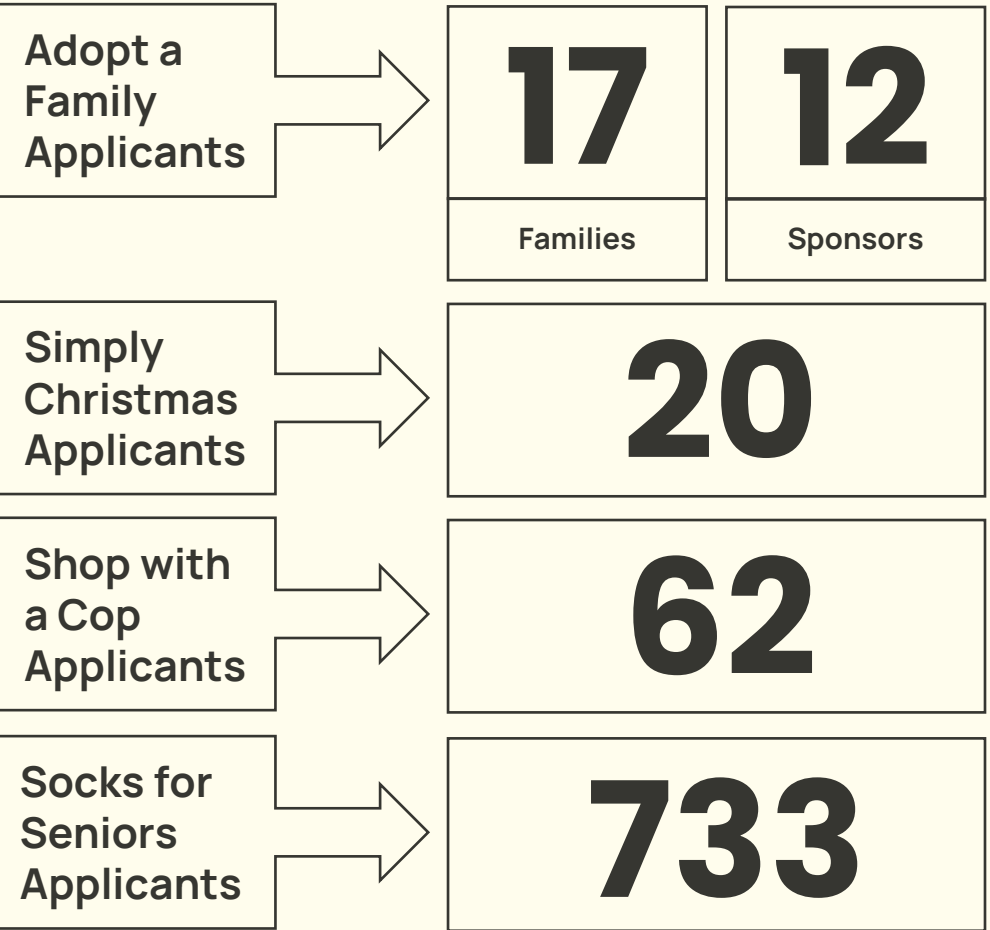

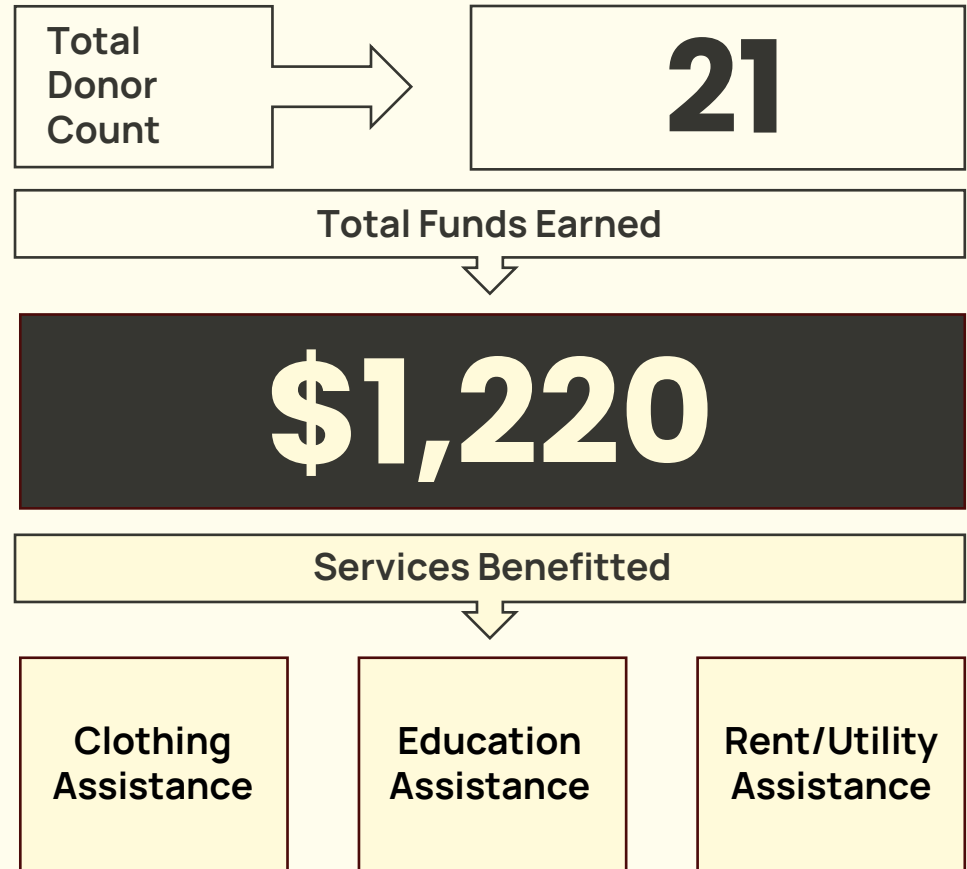

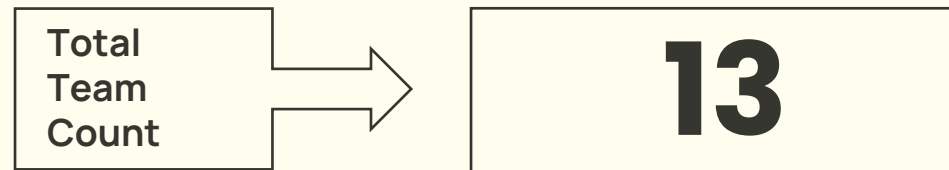

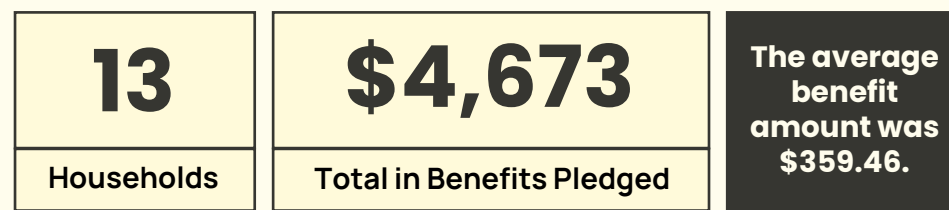

Types of housing assistance include:

- Transitional Housing
- Permanent, Rental Housing

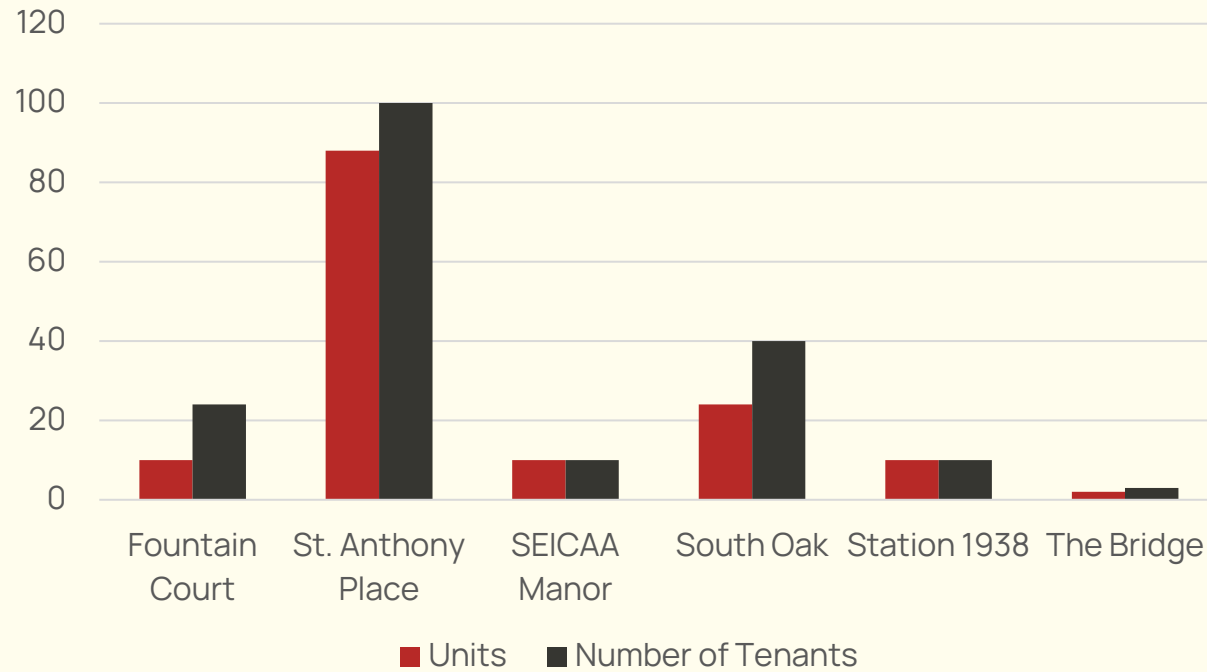
SEICAA Housing further administered our **Veterans Services**, which are available to veterans who face homelessness.

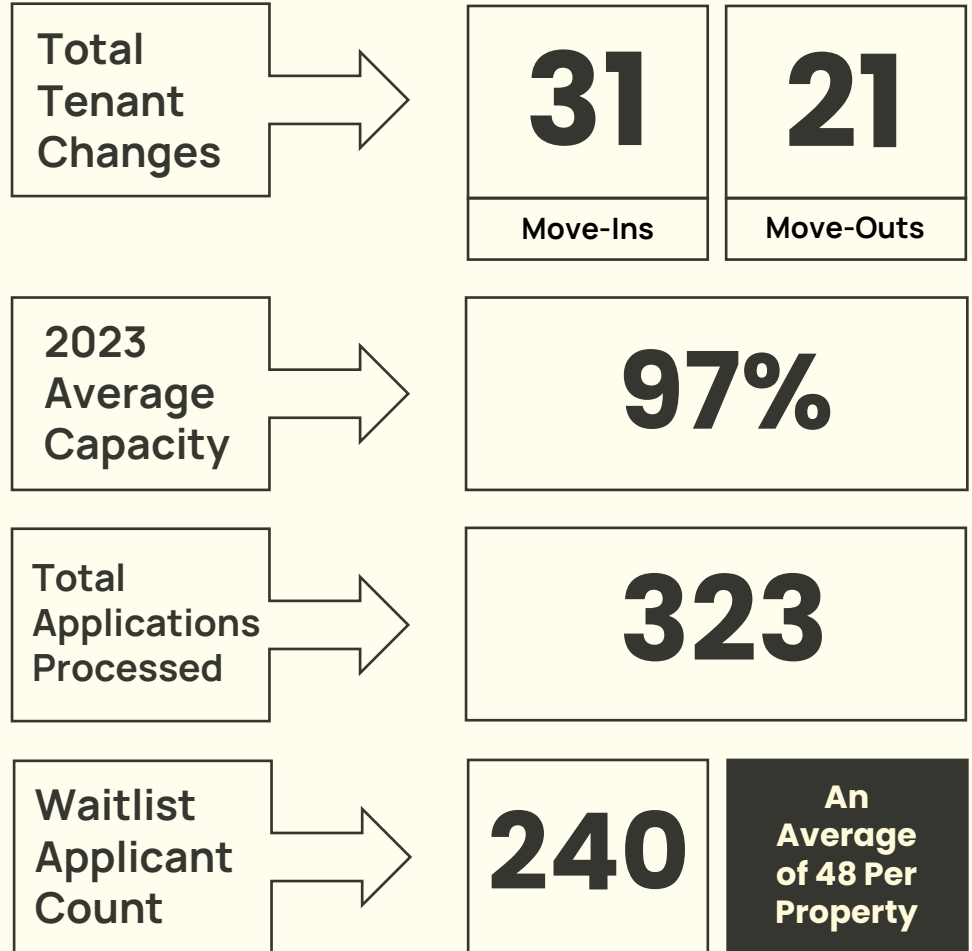

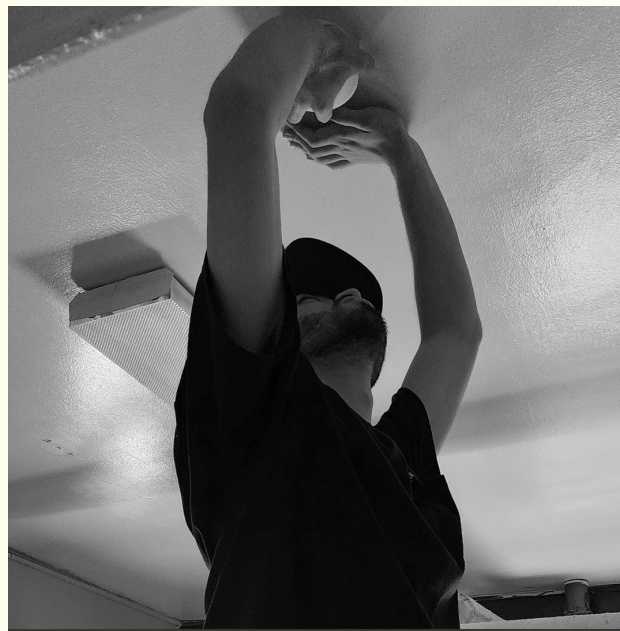

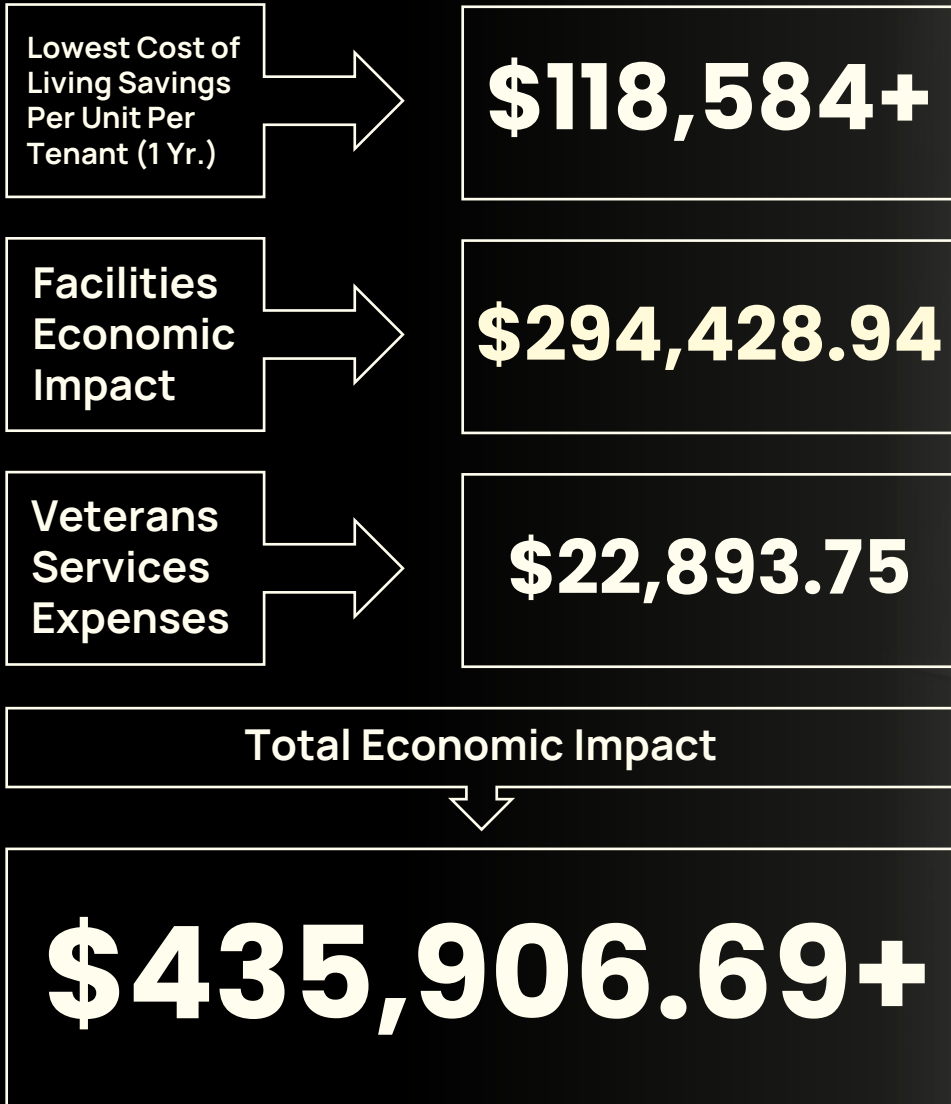

Our **Meals on Wheels** division, known as **SEICAA Meals on Wheels**, provides both nutritious meals and emotional support for homebound seniors and disabled individuals. Our team:

- Supplies nutrition education and information.
- Acts as the “eyes” and “ears” for client’s families by conducting regular safety checks.
- Refers clients to SEICAA and local, non-SEICAA resources.

SEICAA Meals on Wheels further offers:

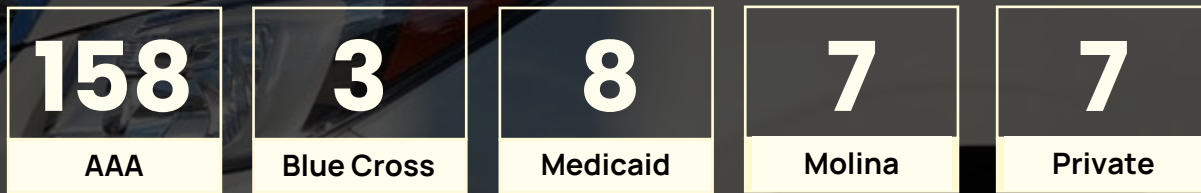
- **Friendly Visits** to help stave off isolation and loneliness.

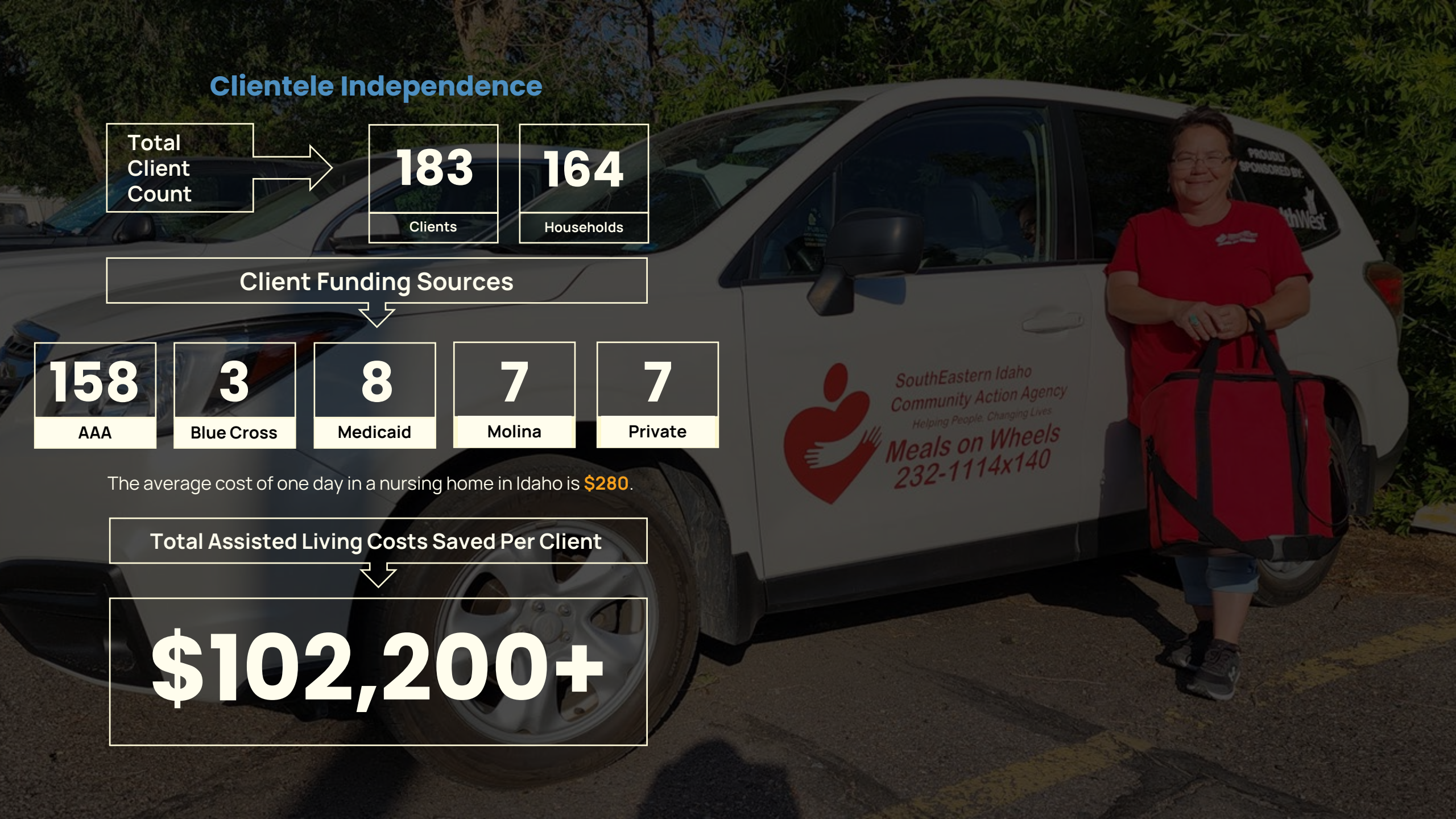

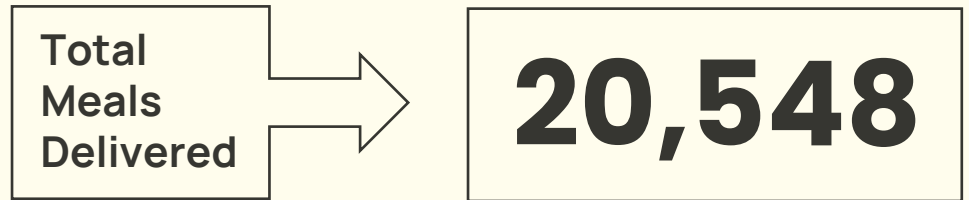

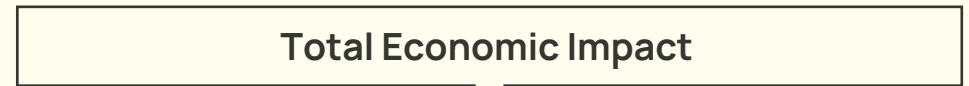

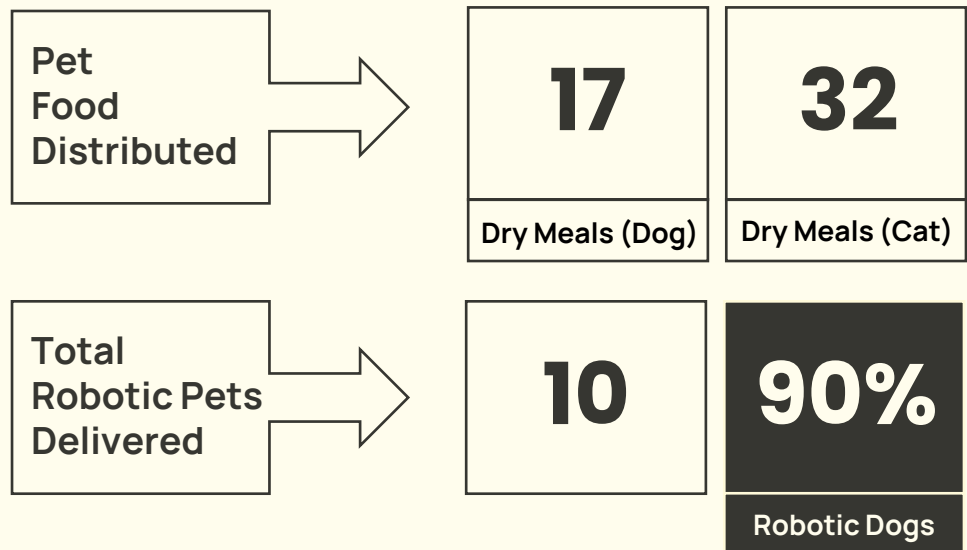

SEICAA Weatherization

Made possible by the U.S. Department of Energy's Weatherization Assistance Program, **SEICAA Weatherization** works to reduce energy costs for low-income households by increasing the energy efficiency of their homes. The results:

- Conserve energy by lowering energy loss and burdens.
- Increase awareness of **potential household hazards**, like:
 - Carbon Monoxide
 - Mold and Moisture
 - Fire
 - Indoor Air Pollutants
 - Lead Paint
 - Radon
- Not only make homes more **comfortable**, but also ensure the household's **health** and **safety**.

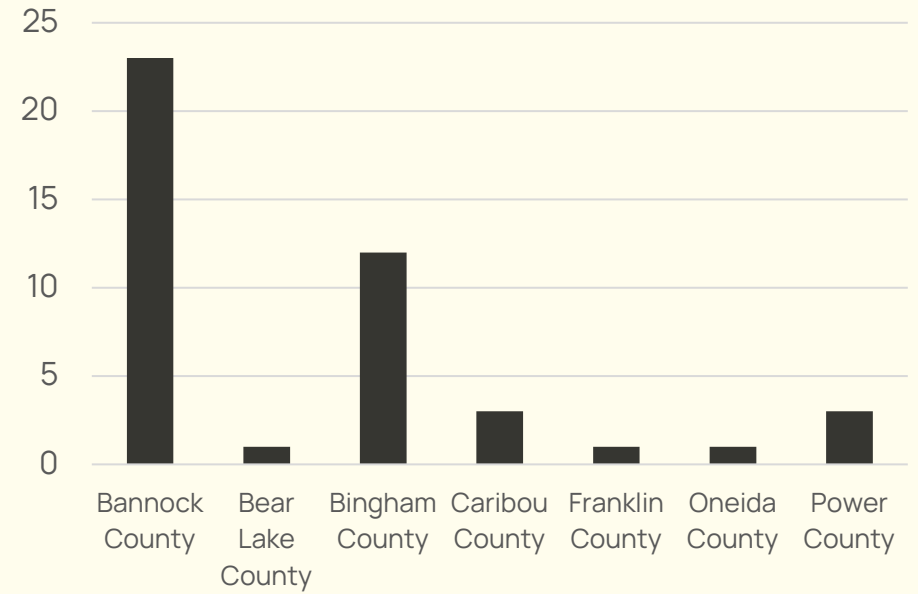

SEICAA Development

Through partnerships with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's **Self-Help Homeownership Opportunity Program (SHOP)** and **Idaho Housing and Finance Association**, SEICAA's Self-Help Housing program was restarted in 2023 to assist first-time homebuyers obtain homeownership in the face of the housing market crisis.

Self-Help Housing develops **new, affordable housing units** for low-income families, often at substantial cost savings earned through donated **sweat equity** and **volunteer labor**.

By the end of the program, families not only own a home:

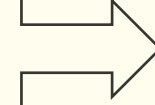
- They have tools necessary to maintain homeownership status.
- They learn basic home maintenance, repair, and weatherization skills.
- They have the opportunity for residential, financial, and social stability.





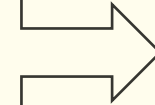

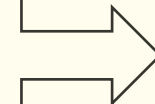

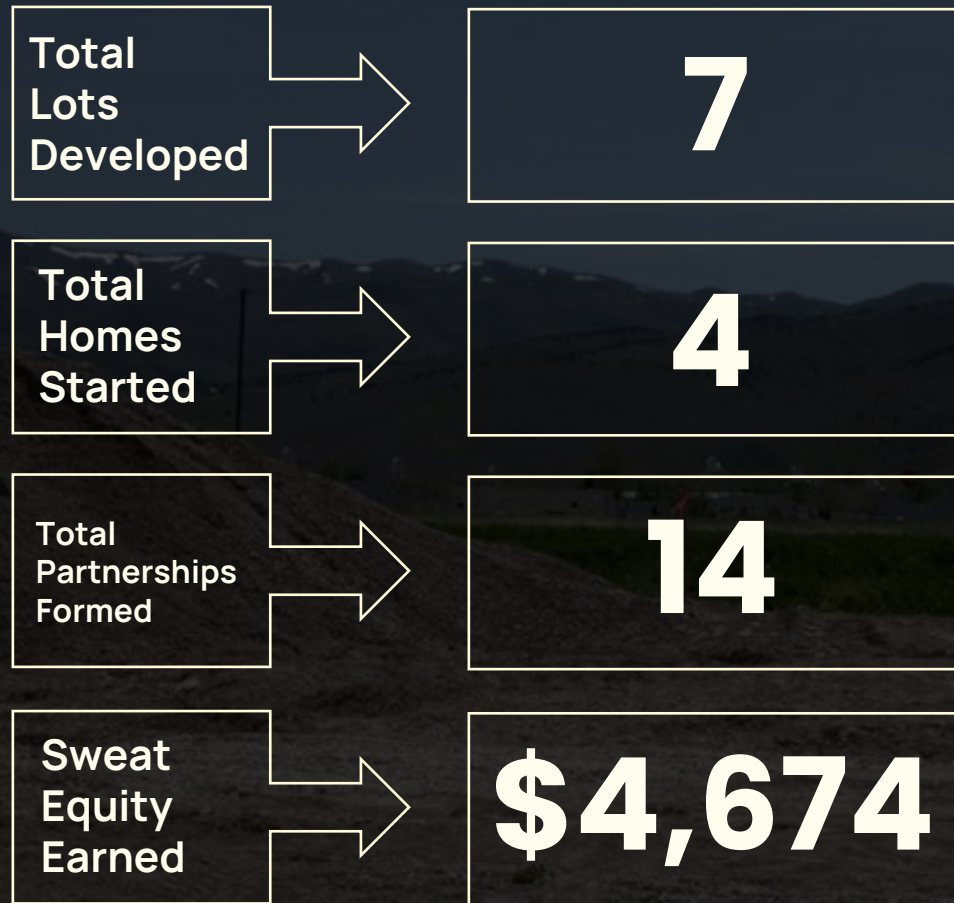

Made possible through partnerships with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Self-Help Homeownership Opportunity Program (SHOP) in 2003, the first Self-Help Housing - referred to then as Mutual Self-Help Housing - initiative took place in American Falls, Idaho in 2004. The pictures above show participating families constructing houses for one another under the supervision of a construction supervisor. From preparing foundation to framing roofs, families not only built houses, but they also built their community.

Over time, our Development team constructed houses in each county in our service area until the program's hiatus in 2020. The program was restarted in 2023.

Alpine Crossing: Phase One

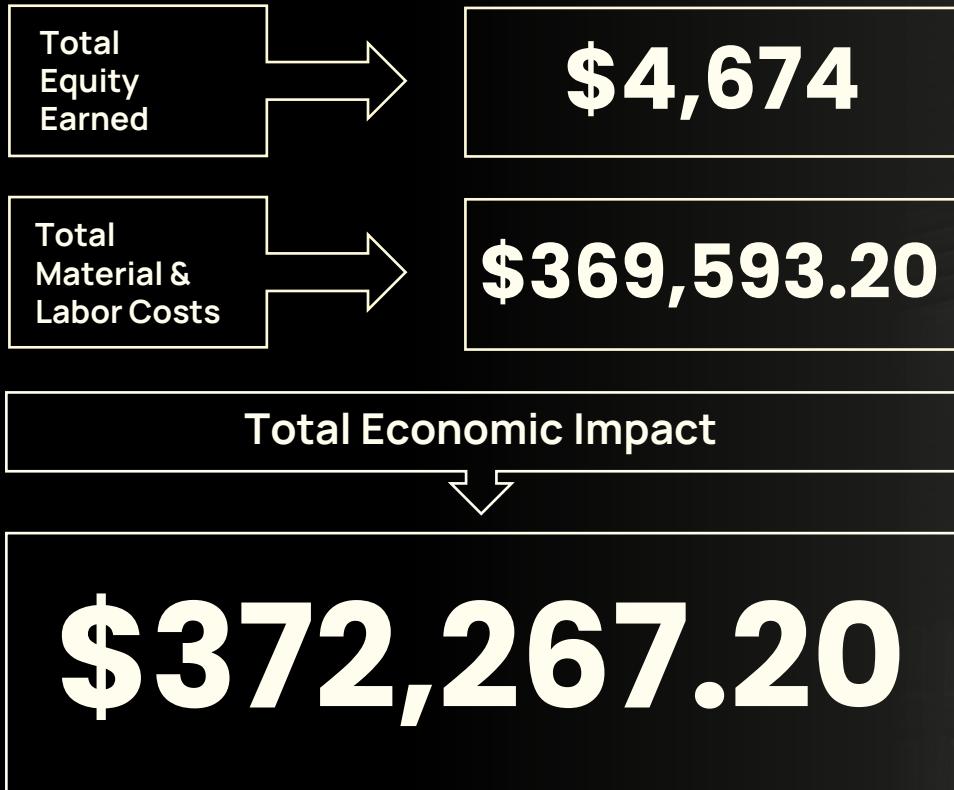
Alpine Crossing's First Phase began **October 1, 2023**. Of the **14** lots designated for development:



Alpine Crossing's Second Phase is set to begin **March 25, 2024**. At the time of writing, our plan is to develop **19** lots.

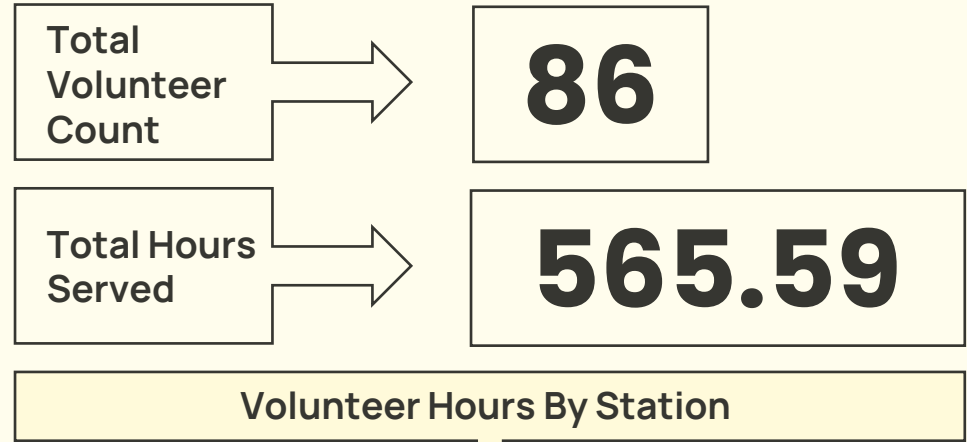

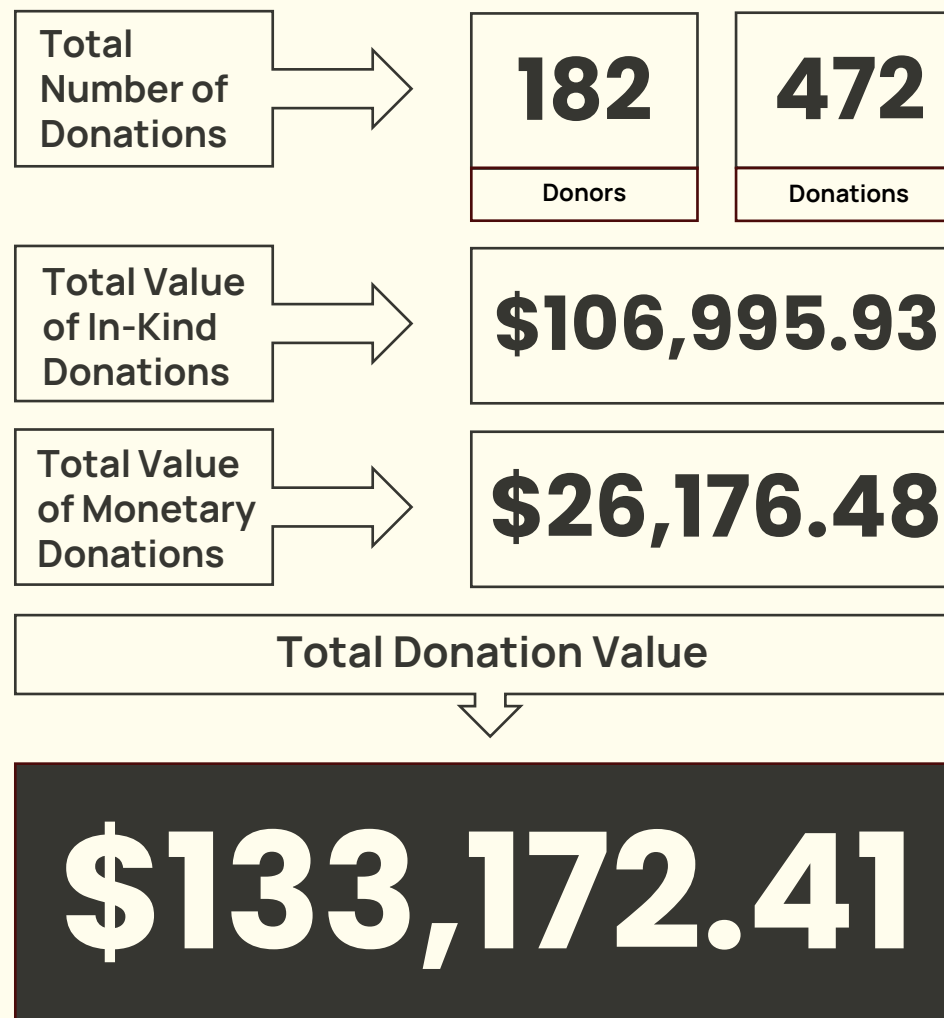
